



Nebraska Registration for Athlete Agent **INITIAL APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS**

Please refer to the following guidelines when completing the initial application.

1. **All questions on the application form(s) must be answered.** Make sure that the affidavit on the last page of the application is signed by the applicant and notarized.
2. The initial registration fee of \$300.00 must be paid in advance. Fees must be made payable to the Nebraska Secretary of State.
3. If applicant is employed by a corporation, submit an attachment that lists the name(s) and address(es) of all officers, directors, and any shareholders of the corporation having an interest of five percent or greater. See Item (8) on application.
4. If applicant's business is not a corporation, submit an attachment that lists the name(s) and address(es) of the partners, members, officers, managers, associates, company owners, for the applicant's business unless individually employed. See Item (8) on application.
5. Download the United State Citizenship Attestation Form located on the Nebraska Department of Administrative Services Web site at http://www.das.state.ne.us/lb403/attestation_form.pdf. Print the form off from this Web site and submit the completed form to our office with the completed application.
6. A certificate of registration for an athlete agent is valid for two years. Registered athlete agents need to renew their registration every two years and pay a \$150.00 renewal fee. Renewal information will be sent to the athlete agent prior to the end of their two year registration.

Notice Attorneys: Please be aware that while registering for an Athlete Agent license allows you to contact persons in Nebraska it does not allow you to operate as an attorney in the state without being duly licensed through the Nebraska Supreme Court and Nebraska State Bar Association. The unauthorized practice of law is prohibited in this state.
