Chapter 4 - Wildlife Regulations

006 Coots, Ducks, Geese, Crow

The following regulations are prescribed by the Game and Parks Commission, State of Nebraska in accordance with Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 37-314, 37-315, 37-405, 37-411, 37-428, 37-501, 37-508, 37-536, 37-563, 37-701. For purposes of these regulations, unless context otherwise requires, the definitions found in Chapter 37, sections 202 through 247 of the Game Law, are used. These regulations are effective following enactment by the Commission, approval by the Attorney General and Governor, and when five days have elapsed since filing with the Secretary of State.

006.01 HUNTING SEASONS

006.01A Ducks and Mergansers (Zone and Management Unit boundaries in 006.01A5).

006.01A1 Open Season:

Low Plains

Zones 1 and 2 (Late): October ~~16~~ 15 through ~~17~~ 16, ~~2010~~ 2011 and October ~~23~~ 22 through January ~~2~~ 1, 2011 2012.

006.01A2 Daily Bag Limit: Conventional System - Six Ducks. May include no more than: Five(5) mallards of which no more than two(2) can be females, zero(0) mottled duck, two (2) pintail, one(1) canvasback, two(2) redheads, two(2) scaup (greater and lesser combined), and three(3) wood ducks.

Mergansers: A daily bag of five (5), only two (2) of which may be a hooded merganser.

006.01A3 Possession Limit: Twice the daily bag.

006.01E Crow - Public Nuisance/Health Hazard Order.

006.01E1 In Buffalo, Dawson, Franklin, Harlan, Kearney, Lincoln and Phelps counties, the crow is concentrated in such a manner and number as to constitute a public nuisance and a health hazard and may be taken using methods authorized during firearm and archery seasons during the period November 16 through January 19 in addition to the regular hunting season dates. Shooting hours shall be in accordance with the regular crow hunting season as specified in regulations. None of the birds taken pursuant to this section, nor their plumage, shall be sold or offered for sale.

006.01F Youth Waterfowl Hunting Season

006.01F1 Eligibility: Youth 15 years of age or younger. Youth ages 12 through 15 must be accompanied by an adult at least 18 years old. Youth younger than 12 must be accompanied by an adult at least 19 years old who possesses a valid Nebraska Small Game Permit. In neither case, the adult will not be allowed to shoot ducks, geese, mergansers or coots.

006.01F2 Species: Ducks, Geese, Mergansers and Coots.

006.01F3 Season Dates (Open Season): The Saturday and Sunday immediately following the close of the teal season in the Low Plains Zone (006.01G2a).

006.01F4 Area Open: Statewide except federal or state refuges unless otherwise authorized.

006.01F5 Daily Bag Limit: Same as allowed in regular duck and merganser (006.01A2), coot (006.01B2) and goose (006.01C1, 006.01C2, 006.01C3) seasons.

006.01F6 Possession Limit: Same as allowed in regular duck and merganser (006.01A3), coot (006.01B3) and goose (006.01C1, 006.01C2,

006.01C3) seasons.

006.01F7 Shooting Hours: 30 minutes before sunrise to sunset.

006.01G Early Teal Season

006.01G1 Species: Blue-winged, Green-winged, and Cinnamon Teal.

006.01G2 Season Dates (Open Season):

006.02 Conservation Actions Orders

The Commission may establish conservation orders or similar wildlife management activities for the conservation of migratory bird populations provided such orders and/or actions activities are approved by the Director of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service or an authorized representative under 50 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 20.

006.02A Geese

006.02A1 Light Geese (Blue, Snow and Ross' Geese) - Zone boundaries are described in 006.01C1h.

006.02A1a Eligibility: Resident persons 16 years of age or older and all nonresidents, regardless of age, participating in a conservation **action order** for the conservation of migratory bird populations shall possess a valid Nebraska Small Game Hunting Permit, valid Nebraska Habitat Stamp, valid Nebraska Migratory Waterfowl Stamp, a Federal Waterfowl Stamp, and shall be registered in Nebraska for the Harvest Information Program (HIP), provided the requirement for the Nebraska Migratory Waterfowl Stamp shall begin January 1, 2006.

006.02A1b Zone 1

006.02A1b(1) Conservation **Action Order** Dates: Beginning the first day after the termination date of the Platte River Unit (006.01C2c(1)) dark goose season and through the Sunday nearest April 15.

006.02A1b(2) Beginning on the date specified in 006.02A1b(1), hunting of light geese is permitted only on Saturdays, Sundays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. Beginning on March 24, hunting is permitted on all days until the end of the Conservation **Action Order** as specified in 006.02A1b(1).

006.02A1b(3) Hunting of light geese is not permitted on the following lands owned, controlled or managed by the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission or the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service: Springer WPA; Massie WPA, Hultine WPA, Wilkins

WPA, Pintail WMA, Verona WPA, Bluebill WMA, Eckhardt WPA, Nelson WPA, Kirkpatrick North WMA, and Swan Creek WMA.

006.02A1b(4) Hunting of light geese is not permitted within 0.5 mile of an area bounded by the outermost channel with flowing water on the north and south sides of the Platte River from U.S. Hwy. 281 to NE Hwy 14.

006.02A1c Zone 2

006.02A1c(1) Conservation **Action Order** Dates: Beginning the first day after the termination date of the Platte River Unit (006.01C2c(1)) dark goose season and through April 1.

006.02A1c(2) Beginning on the date specified in 006.02A1c(1), hunting of light geese is permitted only on Saturdays, Sundays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. Beginning on March 24, hunting is permitted on all days until the end of the Conservation **Action Order** as specified in 006.02A1c(1).

006.02A1c(3) Hunting of light geese is not permitted on the following lands owned, controlled or managed by the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission or the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service: Funk WPA, Prairie Dog WPA, Bluestem WPA, Lindau WPA, and Clark WPA.

006.02A1c(4) For that portion of the Platte River lying south of Interstate 80, the hunting of light geese is not permitted within 0.5 mile of an area bounded by the outermost channel with flowing water on the north and south sides of the

Platte River. Beginning March 11 through the Sunday nearest April 1, for that portion of the Platte River lying south of Interstate 80, the hunting of light geese is not permitted within 3 miles of an area bounded by the outermost channel with flowing water on the north and south sides of the Platte River.

006.02A1d Zone 3

006.02A1d(1) Conservation **Action Order** Dates: Beginning the first day after the termination date of the Platte River Unit (006.01C2c(1)) dark goose season and through the Sunday nearest April 15.

006.02A1e Daily Bag Limit: None.

006.02A1f Possession Limit: None.

006.02A1g Shooting Hours: 30 minutes before sunrise to 30 minutes after sunset.

006.02A1h Area Open: Within management units as delineated except federal or state sanctuaries and refuges, unless otherwise authorized.

006.02A1h(1) Beginning March 11 through the Sunday nearest April 15 within that portion of Zone 3 which is east of U.S. Hwy 283 and west of U.S. Hwy 281, hunting of light geese is not permitted within three(3) miles of an area bounded by the outermost channel of flowing water on the north side of the Platte River.

006.02A1i Use of Recorded or Amplified calls: Permitted only as defined in 001.02A3 and 001.02A3a.

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006.02A1j Baiting: Prohibited as described in 001.02A7.

006.02A1k Transporting: Same as defined in 001.02A9.

006.02A1l Live Decoys: Prohibited as described in 001.02A5.

006.02A1m Weapons Permitted: Same as those defined in State Statute 37-536 and prohibited in section 001.02A6. The use of shotguns capable of holding more than three shells in magazine and chamber combined: Permitted only as defined in 001.02A4a.

006.02A1n Nontoxic Shot: Same as those defined in 011.01 and 011.02.
