Scores

<u>002</u> General Information

- <u>002.01</u> <u>Statutory Authority.</u> This chapter is adopted pursuant to Section 79-808 of the <u>Nebraska Revised Statutes</u> (R.R.S.).
- <u>O02.02</u> <u>Scope and Application.</u> This chapter contains regulations for obtaining endorsements indicating grade levels and areas of specialization on Nebraska teaching, administrative, and special services certificates or permits.
- <u>002.03</u> <u>Related Chapters.</u> Throughout this chapter, reference is made to other Department regulations relating to teachers, administrators, and special services providers. Regulations for the issuance of certificates <u>or permits</u> to teach, administer, and provide special services in Nebraska schools are contained in Title 92, <u>Nebraska Administrative Code</u>, Chapter 21 (92 NAC 21). Title 92, <u>Nebraska Administrative Code</u>, Chapter 23 (92 NAC 23) contains regulations concerning the basic skills competency testing of teacher education <u>candidates</u>. <u>students</u>. Title 92, <u>Nebraska Administrative Code</u>, Chapter 20 (92 NAC 20) contains the rules for the approval of professional education programs in Nebraska. Copies of these rules are available from the Department.
- <u>002.04</u> <u>Implementation Date.</u> Regardless of the effective date of the approval of this chapter, the implementation date will be August 1, 201<u>5</u>4. Colleges and persons seeking endorsements must meet these requirements after this date. Prior to that implementation date, the provisions of this chapter, as approved with an effective date of <u>July 2, 2014</u> <u>June 23, 2013</u> shall remain in effect.

<u>003</u> <u>Definition of Terms.</u> As used in this chapter:

- <u>003.01</u> <u>American Sign Language (ASL)</u> shall mean a natural language indigenous to members of the American Deaf Community, with its own culture, literature, and linguistic structure.
- <u>Approved Endorsement Program</u> shall mean endorsement programs approved pursuant to 92 NAC 20 or any endorsement program approved in any other state or country pursuant to standards comparable and equivalent to 92 NAC 20.
- 003.03 Board shall mean the Nebraska State Board of Education.
- <u>O03.04</u> <u>Certification Officer</u> shall mean a faculty or staff member designated by the chief academic officer or unit administrator of each standard institution of higher education with an approved educator preparation program to receive correspondence regarding this <u>c</u>Chapter from the Department and to provide certified records, transcripts, reports and/or recommendations to the Department, as required, for the purpose of certification and/or endorsement.

- O03.05 Clinical experiences shall mean those that are characterized by careful planning, stipulated goals, required activities, projected performance levels and evaluation of growth. Examples of clinical experiences are microteaching clinics, unit teaching associated with a methodology class, and skill clinics. Activities not meeting the criteria for clinical experiences include general observations, voluntary community service, orientation visits, teacher aiding, and periodic visitations to educational settings.
- <u>003.06</u> <u>Commissioner</u> shall mean the Nebraska State Commissioner of Education.
- <u>O03.07</u> <u>Content Test shall mean a Praxis II or School Leadership Series test published by the Educational Testing Service (ETS) of Princeton, NJ for which a passing score requirement has been established by the Department.</u>
- <u>003.087</u> <u>Credit hour</u> shall mean the equivalent of 15 instructional class periods of 50 minutes or more. Semester hour has the same meaning as credit hour.
- <u>003.097</u> <u>Department</u> shall mean the State Department of Education, which is comprised of the Board and the Commissioner.
- <u>003.1009</u> <u>Endorsement</u> shall mean an area of specialization indicated on a certificate <u>or permit</u> issued pursuant to 92 NAC 21 signifying that the individual has met specific requirements contained in this chapter.
- <u>003.110</u> <u>English as a Second Language (ESL)</u> shall mean a program designed to serve students whose dominant language is not English to become proficient in English through instruction predominantly provided in English to the students.
- <u>003.124</u> <u>Field</u> (used as a descriptor of an endorsement) shall mean two or more subjects which, considered as a single area of study, represent a wider and broader scope than that of a subject.
- <u>Field-based experiences</u> shall mean those that are conducted at a school site, school administration center, school clinic, or community agency, etc. These experiences include classroom observations, tutoring, assisting school administrators or teachers, as well as participation in school and community-wide activities. Planning shall be shared by the professional education unit and the appropriate agency.
- <u>003.143</u> <u>Internship</u> shall mean an experience supervised by a qualified professional who holds a certificate or <u>permit or</u> has qualifications comparable to that of a certificate <u>or permit holder</u>. The internship provides opportunities to

practice and demonstrate the knowledge and skills of the specialization area in a setting that is similar to the setting in which the candidate intends to work. Internship differs from student teaching in that it is only applicable to graduate level and supplemental endorsements.

- <u>O03.15</u> <u>Passing Score shall mean a scaled score on a Praxis II Series or School Leadership Series subject content test as established by the Department.</u>
- <u>003.164</u> <u>Practicum</u> shall mean an extensive experience in which education students practice professional skills and knowledge. Both student teaching and internships are examples of a practicum.
- <u>003.175</u> <u>Prekindergarten</u> shall mean the preschool years for children beginning at age 3 prior to entering kindergarten.
- <u>003.186</u> Regular Certificate shall mean an initial, standard or professional certificate, or a comparable and equivalent certificate as defined in 92 NAC 21.
- <u>003.197</u> <u>Semester Hour</u> shall mean the equivalent of 15 instructional class periods of 50 minutes or more. Credit hour has the same meaning as semester hour.
- <u>003.2048</u> <u>Standard Institution of Higher Education</u> means any college or university, the teacher education programs of which are fully approved by the Board or approved in another state pursuant to standards which are comparable and equivalent to those set by the board.
- <u>003.2149</u> <u>Student teaching</u> shall mean a full time, directed teaching experience conducted in a school setting that provides supervised opportunities to practice and demonstrate over a continuous, extended time period (as required by 92 NAC 20) the unique knowledge and skills of teaching in the endorsement area(s).
- <u>003.220</u> <u>Subject</u> (used as a descriptor of an endorsement) shall mean a specific course or narrow range of courses taught and offered in a school.
- <u>O03.234</u> <u>Supplemental</u> (used as a descriptor of an endorsement) shall mean an endorsement which cannot exist by itself on a certificate <u>or permit</u> but is added to a certificate <u>or permit</u> only in the presence of other endorsements which may or may not be specified.
- <u>003.242</u> <u>Teaching experience</u> shall mean employment as a certified employee for the instruction of students in an approved or accredited school.

004 Application Procedures

<u>004.01</u> <u>Initial Endorsement.</u> When an applicant applies for his or her teaching, administrative, or special services certificate <u>or permit</u> pursuant to 92 NAC 21, he or she will be required to file documentation, signed by a certification officer of a standard institution of higher education, indicating that he or she has met the requirements of this chapter for one or more endorsements (depending upon the requirements of 92 NAC 21 for the type of certificate <u>or permit</u> and the type of endorsements), to file an application and pay the fee provided for in 92 NAC 21. A recommended form (Institutional Verification) is available on the Teacher Certification website.

<u>Additional Endorsements.</u> Additional endorsements may be added to a certificate <u>or permit</u> at any time upon the payment of the fee provided for in 92 NAC 21 and documentation signed by a certification officer of a standard institution of higher education, that clearly show that the endorsement requirements and student teaching experience requirements, if applicable, of this chapter have been met in approved endorsement programs.

<u>004.02A</u> Applicants applying for additional subject or field endorsements have no additional student teaching requirement if the endorsement is for the same grade level as endorsement(s) already held on the certificate. If it is for a different level, the applicant must meet half of the 14 week student teaching requirement through student teaching or internship.

<u>004.03</u> <u>Provisional Endorsements.</u> Individuals holding a regular Nebraska certificate may apply to add one provisional endorsement as follows:

<u>004.03A</u> Completing an application and payment of the statutory fee as required under 92 NAC 21; and

<u>004.03B</u> Submitting a document signed and dated by the certification officer of a Nebraska standard institution of higher education which verifies that the applicant has completed 50 percent of the endorsement credit hour requirement in an approved endorsement program and lists the remaining courses to be completed. A recommended form (Added Provisional Endorsement) is available on the Teacher certification website.

This provisional endorsement cannot be renewed and will expire on August 31 of the third year following issuance.

<u>Provisional Special Education Endorsement.</u> Individuals holding a regular Nebraska certificate may apply to add a provisional special education endorsement. <u>as follows: The provisional special education endorsement shall expire August 31 in the year following the year of issuance and may be renewed two (2) times.</u>

<u>004.04A</u> <u>Each applicant for a provisional special education</u> endorsement shall:

<u>004.04A</u>1 Completeing an application and payment of the statutory fee as required under 92 NAC 21;

<u>004.04A2B</u> Submitting the an-Affirmation of Eligibility form, a copy of which is attached as Appendix B and available on the Teacher Certification website, requesting the issuance of the provisional special education endorsement;

<u>004.04A3C</u> Submitting an official transcript from a standard institution of higher education that demonstrates at least six (6) three (3) semester hours of coursework has already been completed for the provisional special education endorsement; and

<u>004.04A4D</u> Submitting a document that is signed and dated by the certification officer from a Nebraska standard institution of higher education which verifies that the applicant has established a plan for completion of course work leading to a regular special education endorsement, including completion of a minimum of 18 hours during the three (3) years for which the provisional endorsement is valid. A recommended form, (Added Provisional Endorsement,) is available on the Teacher Certification website.

<u>004.04B</u> <u>Each applicant for renewal of a provisional special education</u> endorsement shall:

<u>004.04B1</u> <u>Complete an application and pay the statutory fee as required under 92 NAC 21; and</u>

<u>004.04B2</u> <u>Submit an official transcript verifying completion of at least nine (9) semester hours of course work from the established plan for completion of course work leading to a regular special education endorsement.</u>

The provisional special education endorsement shall expire August 31 in the third year following issuance and may be renewed for an additional three (3) years if the individual completes at least 18 credit hours as set forth in Section 004.04D.

<u>004.05</u> <u>Duration of Endorsements</u>

<u>004.05A</u> Endorsements, once granted, continue in effect so long as the holder maintains a certificate <u>or permit</u> in force, or until revoked or amended pursuant to state law or regulation.

<u>004.05B</u> Provisional endorsements continue for three (3) years.

<u>004.05C</u> Provisional special education endorsements <u>must be</u> <u>renewed annually.</u> continue for three (3) years.

<u>004.05D</u> If an endorsement is amended through changes to this <u>c</u>Chapter but the title remains the same, current holders of that endorsement will continue to have that endorsement in effect for their current and future certificat<u>esion or permits</u>. If an endorsement is no longer contained in this chapter because it has been repealed or the title and requirements have changed, the following provisions apply:

004.05D1 If a comparable existing endorsement is listed for such former endorsement in Appendix A of this <u>c</u>Chapter, the certificate <u>or permit</u> holder will be considered to hold such comparable endorsement for purposes of determining school or school district compliance with approval or accreditation requirements under Chapters 10 or 14 of this Title, and for purposes of the requirements of any other chapter of this Title. At the time of future <u>renewals</u>, <u>recertification</u>, the new certificate <u>or permit</u> will carry the comparable endorsement.

<u>004.05D2</u> If an endorsement that was formerly designated as a subject or field endorsement is reclassified as a supplemental endorsement, the endorsement will continue to be placed on a certificate <u>or permit</u> as a subject or field endorsement if the subject or field endorsement appeared on a certificate <u>or permit</u> prior to the implementation date of the reclassification, or if the individual seeking the endorsement completes a program for which a standard institution of higher education makes recommendation for a subject or field endorsement within one year of the implementation date of the reclassification.

<u>004.05D3</u> If no comparable endorsement is listed in Appendix A, the endorsement shall be considered non-existent for purposes of Department regulations.

<u>004.06</u> <u>Revocation of Endorsements.</u> Endorsements shall be revoked for any of the following reasons:

<u>004.06A</u> Revocation of the certificate <u>or permit</u>.

<u>004.06B</u> Fraud, misrepresentation, or error.

<u>004.06C</u> Written request by the endorsed person to the Commissioner and the Commissioner determines that the person has no employment

experience and no college credit in the endorsed area within ten (10) years prior to the written request.

<u>004.06D</u> Elimination of the endorsement by the Board as shown in Appendix A.

<u>004.06E</u> Replacement of the endorsement by the Board with another endorsement as shown in Appendix A.

<u>004.07</u> <u>Hearings and Appeals.</u> All actions taken by the Department under the provisions of this chapter may be subject to appeal under the appeals procedure contained in 92 NAC 21.

O04.08 Certification of Completion of Endorsement Requirements. Certification officers shall be required, as a condition of institution approval pursuant to 92 NAC 20, to certify for the Department the completion of endorsement requirements as specified in this chapter as part of endorsement applications.

<u>005</u> <u>Administrative Endorsements</u>

005.01 <u>Curriculum Supervisor</u>

005.01A Grade Levels: PK-12

005.01B Endorsement Type: Field/Administrative

<u>005.01C</u> Persons with this endorsement may assist in or supervise the development of curriculum programs for students in prekindergarten through grade 12.

<u>005.01D</u> Certification Endorsement Requirements: The curriculum supervisor endorsement shall require a minimum of 36 graduate semester hours.

<u>005.01E</u> Additional Requirements: The applicant for admission to the program of studies leading to this endorsement must:

<u>005.01E1</u> Have a valid regular teaching certificate,

<u>005.01E2</u> Have completed two (2) years of teaching experience in an approved or accredited school system or school, and

<u>005.01E3</u> Be officially admitted to the program following institutional screening to determine the candidate's suitability as a supervisor of curriculum.

<u>005.01F</u> Endorsement Program Requirements: Nebraska teacher education institutions offering this endorsement program must have on file, within the institution, a plan which identifies the courses and the course completion requirements which the institution utilizes to grant credit toward completion of this endorsement.

005.02 Principal

005.02A Grade Levels: PK-12, PK-8, or 7-12

<u>005.02B</u> Endorsement Type: Field/Administrative

<u>005.02C</u> Persons with this endorsement may serve in all general administrative and supervisory capacities in Nebraska schools as a principal at the grade levels for which the program preparation was completed.

O05.02D Certification Endorsement Requirements: This endorsement shall require 36 or 45 graduate semester hours of credit in an approved program in educational administration. Thirty-six (36) graduate semester hours are required if the principal endorsement is at the same level as the teaching endorsement. Those seeking a principal endorsement at a level different from their teaching endorsement must complete a minimum of nine (9) additional credit hours. The focus of the additional nine (9) credit hours must be specific to the new level.

<u>005.02D1</u> The applicant for this endorsement shall have two (2) years of teaching experience in an approved/accredited elementary, middle, and/or secondary schools.

<u>005.02D2</u> Internship/Field-Based Experiences: This endorsement requires 250 clock hours of internship/ field-based experiences in approved or accredited elementary, middle, or secondary schools. These hours must be completed at the level(s) for the endorsement(s) being sought.

<u>005.02E</u> Endorsement Program Requirements: Nebraska teacher education institutions offering this endorsement program must have on file, within the institution, a plan which identifies the courses and the course completion requirements which the institution utilizes to grant credit toward completion of this endorsement.

<u>005.02F</u> <u>Effective September 1, 2015, an applicant will be required to submit a passing score as set forth in Appendix C for the applicable</u>

content test for the first-time placement of this endorsement on a Nebraska certificate or permit.

<u>005.03</u> <u>Special Education Supervisor</u>

<u>005.03A</u> Grade Levels: Birth through Grade 12

<u>005.03B</u> <u>Endorsement Type: Field/Administrative</u>

<u>005.03C</u> Persons with this endorsement may serve in all special education administrative and supervisory roles in Nebraska schools providing services for students with disabilities, birth through age 21.

O05.03D Certification Endorsement Requirements: The Special Education Supervisor endorsement shall require a minimum of 36 graduate semester hours related to educational leadership and special education administration coursework, and include an internship experience in special education supervision.

<u>005.03D1</u> Additional requirements: For admission to the program of study leading to this endorsement, the applicant must have or be eligible to hold a valid regular teaching certificate with a special education endorsement; and

<u>005.03D2</u> <u>Have completed two (2) years of teaching in an approved or accredited school system.</u>

<u>005.03E</u> <u>Endorsement Program Requirements: Nebraska teacher</u> <u>education institutions offering this endorsement program must have on file,</u> <u>within the institution, a plan which identifies the courses and the course completion requirements which the institution utilizes to grant credit toward completion of this endorsement.</u>

<u>005.03F</u> <u>Effective September 1, 2015, an applicant will be required to submit a passing score as set forth in Appendix C for the applicable content test for the first-time placement of this endorsement on a Nebraska certificate or permit.</u>

005.043 Superintendent

<u>005.043A</u> Grade Levels: PK-12

005.043B Endorsement Type: Field/Administrative

<u>005.043C</u> Persons with this endorsement may serve in all general administrative and supervisory capacities in Nebraska schools as superintendent, principal, or other administrative roles at all levels.

<u>005.043D</u> Certification Endorsement Requirements: This endorsement requires a minimum of 60 graduate semester hours (beyond the baccalaureate degree) in educational administration, completion of a specialist or doctoral program in an education administration program developed for the preparation of a superintendent, and a one-semester internship in an approved or accredited school system.

<u>005.043D1</u> The applicant for this endorsement must qualify for a regular teaching certificate and an administrative certificate and have two (2) years of teaching experience.

<u>005.043E</u> Endorsement Program Requirements: Nebraska teacher education institutions offering this endorsement program must have on file, within the institution, a plan which identifies the courses and the course completion requirements which the institution utilizes to grant credit toward completion of this endorsement.

<u>005.043E1</u> The applicant shall be admitted to the program of studies leading to this endorsement following a screening process which includes (1) a review of transcripts, (2) three letters of recommendation from people who know of the candidate's work, (3) successful completion of a qualifying examination as identified by the standard institution, and (4) a written statement from the candidate outlining his/her professional goals.

<u>005.04F</u> <u>Effective September 1, 2015, an applicant will be required to submit a passing score as set forth in Appendix C for the applicable content test for the first-time placement of this endorsement on a Nebraska certificate or permit.</u>

006 Teaching Endorsements

006.01 Adapted Physical Education

<u>006.01A</u> Grade Level: PK-12

<u>006.01B</u> Endorsement Type: Supplemental endorsement only. To qualify for this endorsement, the applicant shall have or earn concurrently, one of the following endorsements: Health and Physical Education, Physical Education, or one of the Special Education endorsements.

<u>006.01C</u> Persons with this endorsement may teach physical education to children and youth in prekindergarten through grade 12 who have unique needs or verified disabilities. Persons with this endorsement may provide consultant services to teachers of students with unique needs or verified disabilities.

<u>006.01D</u> Certification Endorsement Requirements: This endorsement shall require a minimum of 24 semester hours of coursework. Applicants may apply up to 12 semester hours of coursework completed as part of a subject or field endorsement in Physical Education or Special Education toward requirements of this endorsement. The hours shall include the following:

<u>006.01D1</u> Coursework in special education – six (6) semester hours:

<u>006.01D2</u> Coursework in the content areas of physical education instruction – six (6) semester hours;

<u>006.01D3</u> A minimum of 12 semester hours in adapted physical education courses.

<u>006.01E</u> Endorsement Program Requirements: Nebraska teacher education institutions offering this endorsement program must have on file, within the institution, a plan which identifies the courses and the course completion requirements which the institution utilizes to grant credit toward completion of this endorsement.

<u>006.02</u> <u>Agricultural Education</u>

<u>006.02A</u> Grade Levels: 6-12

006.02B Endorsement Type: Field

<u>006.02C</u> Persons with this endorsement may teach and manage an agricultural education program and will be eligible for the Cooperative Education/Diversified Occupations endorsement.

<u>006.02D</u> Certification Endorsement Requirements: This endorsement shall require a minimum of 48 semester hours of agriculture subject matter plus work experience including:

<u>006.02D1</u> A minimum of 12 semester hours in agricultural education which includes principles/foundations of career education and supervision of work-based learning; and

<u>006.02D2</u> A minimum of 36 semester hours from the areas of: Agribusiness Systems; Animal Systems; Environmental Service Systems; Food Products and Processing Systems; Natural Resources Systems; Plant Systems; and Power, Structural, and Technical Systems, including leadership, research, applied technology, and policy within the aforementioned systems.

<u>006.02D3</u> Work Experience: The endorsement is only available to those persons who have (A) 1000 verified hours of work experience in the agriculture food, and natural resources career area, or (B) at least 300 hours of supervised employment in the agriculture food, and natural resources career(s), under the direction of the college or university recommending the endorsement.

<u>006.02E</u> Endorsement Program Requirements: Nebraska teacher education institutions offering this endorsement program must have on file, within the institution, a plan which identifies the courses and the course completion requirements which the institution utilizes to grant credit toward completion of this endorsement.

<u>006.02F</u> <u>Effective September 1, 2015, an applicant will be required to submit a passing score as set forth in Appendix C for the applicable content test for the first-time placement of this endorsement on a Nebraska certificate or permit.</u>

006.03 American Sign Language (Subject)

006.03A Grade Levels: K-8, 7-12, or K-12

006.03B Endorsement Type: Subject

<u>006.03C</u> Persons with this endorsement may teach American Sign Language (ASL) at the grade level(s) for which they have been prepared.

<u>006.03D</u> Certification Endorsement Requirements: This endorsement requires a minimum of 30 semester hours of ASL content coursework.

<u>006.03D1</u> Practicum. Prospective teachers shall be engaged in practicum experience at the level(s) of endorsement.

<u>006.03E</u> Endorsement Program Requirements: Nebraska teacher education institutions offering this endorsement program must have on file, within the institution, a plan which identifies the courses and the course completion requirements which the institution utilizes to grant credit toward completion of this endorsement.

<u>006.04</u> American Sign Language (Supplemental)

<u>006.04A</u> Grade Levels: K-8, 7-12, or K-12

<u>006.04B</u> Endorsement Type: Supplemental endorsement only. This endorsement requires an applicant to hold or earn concurrently a subject or field endorsement.

<u>006.04C</u> Persons with this endorsement may teach American Sign Language (ASL) at the grade level(s) for which they have been prepared.

<u>006.04D</u> Certification Endorsement Requirements: This endorsement shall require a minimum of 18 semester hours of coursework in ASL content.

<u>006.05A</u> Grade Levels: 7-12

<u>006.05B</u> Endorsement Type: Subject

<u>006.05C</u> Persons with this endorsement may teach anthropology in grades 7 through 12.

O06.05D Certification Endorsement Requirements: This endorsement requires a minimum of 36 semester hours including 30 semester hours in anthropology and six (6) semester hours in one or more of the other social sciences areas (Economics, Geography, History, Political Science, Psychology, and/or Sociology).

<u>006.13C</u> Persons with this endorsement may teach any chemistry course in grades 7 through 12.

<u>006.13D</u> Certification Endorsement Requirements: This endorsement shall require a minimum of 36 semester hours of laboratory based courses in the natural sciences (biology, chemistry, Earth and space science, and

physics), of which 24 semester hours must be in chemistry and a minimum of 12 semester hours of laboratory based courses among the remaining three natural sciences areas. A laboratory-based course provides activity-based, hands-on experience for all students. Laboratory activities shall be designed to allow students to develop scientific skills and processes, discover and construct science concepts, and allow for the application of the concept to the real lives of students.

<u>006.13E</u> Endorsement Program Requirements: Nebraska teacher education institutions offering this endorsement program must have on file, within the institution, a plan which identifies the courses and the course completion requirements which the institution utilizes to grant credit toward completion of this endorsement.

006.14 Coaching

<u>006.14B</u> Endorsement Type: Supplemental endorsement only. This endorsement requires an applicant to have, or earn concurrently, a subject or field endorsement.

<u>006.14C</u> Persons with this endorsement may coach interscholastic athletic events for participants in grades 7 through 12.

Occided to Certification Endorsement Requirements: This endorsement requires a minimum of 12 semester hours of coursework related to coaching athletics, including first aid, health and safety for coaches; prevention, care, and management of injuries; fundamentals of coaching, including psychology of coaching and coaching theory; and prevention, care and management of injuries; growth, development and learning.; psychology of coaching; and coaching theory. Other courses related to coaching athletics such as legal aspects and responsibilities; training and conditioning; nutrition; and administration of sports shall be used to fulfill any remaining coaching semester hours.

<u>006.15E</u> Work Experience: This endorsement is available only to those who have either (A) 1,000 verified hours of volunteer, internship, or paid work experience, or (B) at least 300 hours of supervised work experience under the direction of the college or university recommending the endorsement.

A laboratory-based course provides activity-based, hands-on experience for all students. Laboratory activities shall be designed to allow students to develop scientific skills and processes, discover and construct science concepts, and allow for the application of the concept to the real lives of students.

<u>006.19E</u> Endorsement Program Requirements: Nebraska teacher education institutions offering this endorsement program must have on file, within the institution, a plan which identifies the courses and the course completion requirements which the institution utilizes to grant credit toward completion of this endorsement.

<u>006.19F</u> <u>Effective September 1, 2015, an applicant will be required to submit a passing score as set forth in Appendix C for the applicable content test for the first-time placement of this endorsement on a Nebraska certificate or permit.</u>

006.20 Economics

<u>006.20A</u> Grade Levels: 7-12

<u>006.20B</u> Endorsement Type: Subject

<u>006.20C</u> Persons with this endorsement may teach economics in grades 7 through 12.

O06.20D Certification Endorsement Requirements: This endorsement requires a minimum of 36 semester hours including 30 hours in economics and six (6) semester hours in one or more of the other social sciences areas (Geography, History, Political Science, Psychology, and/or either Anthropology or Sociology).

<u>006.20E</u> Endorsement Program Requirements: Nebraska teacher education institutions offering this endorsement program must have on file, within the institution, a plan which identifies the courses and the course completion requirements which the institution utilizes to grant credit toward completion of this endorsement. The courses shall incorporate the Nebraska social studies/history content standards found in 92 NAC 10 into the curriculum as applicable to the grade level endorsement.

<u>006.20F</u> <u>Effective September 1, 2015, an applicant will be required to submit a passing score as set forth in Appendix C for the applicable content test for the first-time placement of this endorsement on a Nebraska certificate or permit.</u>

<u>006.21</u> <u>Elementary Education</u>

006.21A Grade levels: K-6 (K-8 in self-contained classrooms)

006.21B Endorsement Type: Field

<u>006.21C</u> Persons with this endorsement may teach children in all elementary subjects in kindergarten through grade 6 in all schools; and in grades 7 and 8 in self-contained classrooms. Self-contained classrooms exist when students spend more than half the school day with one teacher who provides instruction in more than half of the academic areas of the curriculum.

<u>006.21D</u> Certification Endorsement Requirements: This endorsement shall require professional education coursework related to teaching children from kindergarten through grade eight and academic coursework in all areas of the elementary curriculum.

<u>006.21D2</u> A minimum of 30 semester hours of academic coursework distributed across the four curriculum areas of English language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies/history. A minimum of six (6) semester hours is required in each of the four areas. Coursework in the four core areas includes:

<u>006.21D2a</u> Communication, including literature, composition and speech;

006.21D2b Mathematics;

006.21D2c Natural sciences; and

006.21D2d Social sciences.

<u>006.21D3</u> In addition to the 30 semester hours listed above, academic coursework is required in each of the following areas:

006.21D3a Fine arts and humanities, and;

006.21D3b Health and wellness.

<u>006.21E</u> Endorsement Program Requirements: Nebraska teacher education institutions offering this endorsement program must have on file, within the institution, a plan which identifies the courses and the course completion requirements which the institution utilizes to grant credit toward completion of this endorsement.

<u>006.21F</u> <u>Effective September 1, 2015, an applicant will be required to submit a passing score as set forth in Appendix C for the applicable content test for the first-time placement of this endorsement on a Nebraska certificate or permit.</u>

<u>006.22</u> <u>English</u>

006.22A Grade Levels: 7-12

006.22B Endorsement Type: Subject

<u>006.22C</u> Persons with this endorsement may teach writing, language, and literature in grades 7 through 12.

<u>006.22D</u> Certification Endorsement Requirements: This endorsement shall require a minimum of 30 semester hours in writing, language, and literature coursework.

<u>006.22E</u> Endorsement Program Requirements: Nebraska teacher education institutions offering this endorsement program must have on file, within the institution, a plan which identifies the courses and the course completion requirements which the institution utilizes to grant credit toward completion of this endorsement.

O06.22F This endorsement is available for placement on a Nebraska certificate only for those individuals who held this endorsement, or are recommended for the endorsement by a Standard Institution of Higher Education prior to August 1, 2015. Nebraska institutions will not be able to recommend this endorsement for placement on a certificate after August 1, 2015.

<u>006.23</u> English As A Second Language

<u>006.25D2</u> Nine (9) semester hours – Consumer Economics and Family Resources

<u>006.25D3</u> Nine (9) semester hours – Family and Human Development

within the institution, a plan which identifies the courses and the course completion requirements which the institution utilizes to grant credit toward completion of this endorsement.

<u>006.26F</u> Effective September 1, 2015, an applicant will be required to submit a passing score as set forth in Appendix C for the applicable content test for the first-time placement of this endorsement on a Nebraska certificate or permit.

006.27 Geography

<u>006.27A</u> Grade Levels: 7-12

006.27B Endorsement Type: Subject

<u>006.27C</u> Persons with this endorsement may teach geography in grades 7 through 12.

<u>006.27D</u> Certification Endorsement Requirements: This endorsement requires a minimum of 36 semester hours including 30 hours in geography and six (6) semester hours in one or more of the other social sciences areas (Economics, History, Political Science, Psychology, and/or either Anthropology or Sociology).

<u>006.27E</u> Endorsement Program Requirements: Nebraska teacher education institutions offering this endorsement program must have on file, within the institution, a plan which identifies the courses and the course completion requirements which the institution utilizes to grant credit toward completion of this endorsement. <u>006.698C</u> Persons with this endorsement may teach and direct, or act as a resource person, for curricular and cocurricular activities in theatre in grades 7 through 12.

<u>006.698D</u> Certification Endorsement Requirements: This endorsement shall require a minimum of 18 semester hours in dramatic literature, history of the theatre, acting, stagecraft, costume and makeup, lighting, directing theatre productions, and theatre management, including an approved field experience.

<u>006.698E</u> Endorsement Program Requirements: Nebraska teacher education institutions offering this endorsement program must have on file, within the institution, a plan which identifies the courses and the course completion requirements which the institution utilizes to grant credit toward completion of this endorsement.

006.7069 Vocal Music

<u>006.7069A</u> Grade Levels: K-8; 7-12

<u>006.7069B</u> Endorsement Type: Subject

<u>006.7069C</u> Persons with this endorsement may teach vocal music in the grade levels of their endorsements (K-8 and/or 7-12).

<u>006.7069D</u> Certification Endorsement Requirements: This endorsement shall require a minimum of 30 semester hours for either the K-8 or 7-12 endorsement, or 40 semester hours if the two endorsements are earned at the same time. Coursework shall include theory and composition, music history and literature, conducting, vocal performing, and techniques and methodologies for the grade levels of the endorsement, and must include proficiency in at least one applied area.

<u>006.71</u> Endorsement Type: Supplemental endorsement only. This endorsement requires an applicant to have a field or subject endorsement.

<u>006.71</u><u>0C</u> Persons with this endorsement may teach vocational education to students with disadvantages and/or disabilities in grades 7 through 12.

<u>006.719D</u> Certification Endorsement Requirements: This endorsement requires a minimum of nine (9) semester hours in vocational special needs courses.

<u>006.71</u><u>0E</u> Endorsement Program Requirements: Nebraska teacher education institutions offering this endorsement program must have on file, within the institution, a plan which identifies the courses and the course completion requirements which the institution utilizes to grant credit toward completion of this endorsement.

<u>006.724</u> World Language: Any language other than English, not including computer languages.

<u>006.724A</u> Grade Levels: K-8, 7-12, or K-12

006.724B Endorsement Type: Subject

<u>006.724C</u> Persons with this endorsement may teach at the grade levels and the world language(s) for which they have been prepared.

<u>006.724D</u> Certification Endorsement Requirements: This endorsement requires a minimum of 30 semester hours in the world language for either the K-8 or 7-12 endorsement. Those candidates seeking a K-12 endorsement must complete coursework and clinical experiences which address elementary and secondary levels.

<u>006.724D1</u> Upon successful completion of the Official American Council for the Teaching of Foreign Languages (ACTFL) Oral Proficiency Interview (OPI) and the Official ACTFL Writing Proficiency Test (WPT) at the Advanced-Low level of proficiency in the target languages of French, German, Hebrew, Italian, Portuguese, Russian, and/or Spanish, and at the Intermediate-High level for Arabic, Chinese, Japanese, and/or Korean, the Nebraska teacher education institutions may waive up to 15 hours of the 30 hours required in the world language.

<u>007.01B</u> Endorsement Type: Special Services

<u>007.01C</u> Persons with this endorsement may serve as an audiologist <u>or consultant</u> and resource person for programs involving individuals from birth through <u>age 21. grade 12.</u>

<u>007.01D</u> Certification Endorsement Requirements: This endorsement shall require a current Nebraska license as a Registered Audiologist from the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services.requires a

minimum of a master's degree in audiology, which includes at least 36 graduate semester hours in an educational audiology program approved under this chapter. This program also includes 70 clock hours of a school internship in educational audiology supervised by a standard institution faculty member (the internship requirement may be included in the 36 graduate semester hours).

<u>007.01E</u> Endorsement Program Requirements: Nebraska teacher education institutions offering this endorsement program must have on file, within the institution, a plan which identifies the courses and the course completion requirements which the institution utilizes to grant credit toward completion of this endorsement.

007.02 School Nurse

<u>007.02A</u> Grade Levels: PK-12

<u>007.02B</u> Endorsement Type: Special Services

<u>007.02C</u> Persons with this endorsement may practice school nursing for students prekindergarten through grade 12.

<u>007.02D</u> Certification Endorsement Requirements: This endorsement shall require a current Nebraska license as a Registered Professional Nurse from the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services or another state participating in the Nurse Licensure Compact as defined in Section 71-1795 R.R.S.

007.03 School Transition Specialist

<u>007.03A</u> Grade Levels: 7-12

007.03B Special Services Endorsement

<u>007.03C</u> Persons with this Special Services Endorsement may counsel and provide services for youth with disabilities and consult with teachers, parents, and students in grades 7 through 12.

<u>007.03D</u> Certification Endorsement Requirements: This Special Services Endorsement shall require a minimum of 18 graduate semester hours of coursework and clinical experience with emphasis on children and youth, ages 14 to 21, with disabilities. Candidates for this program will have completed a Master's Degree or be concurrently engaged in a Master's program with the awarding of the endorsement dependent upon successful completion of the Master's program.

<u>007.03E</u> Endorsement Program Requirements: Nebraska teacher education institutions offering this endorsement program must have on file, within the institution, a plan which identifies the courses and the course completion requirements which the institution utilizes to grant credit toward completion of this endorsement.

<u>007.034</u> Speech Language Technician

<u>007.034A</u> Grade Levels: Birth to age 21

007.034B Endorsement Type: Special Services

<u>007.034C</u> Persons with this endorsement may provide speech-language services for individuals from birth to age 21. The person must be supervised by a certified speech-language pathologist. The person may not fulfill the requirement(s) of a speech-language pathologist on a multi-disciplinary evaluation team or an individualized family service plan (IFSP) team or individual education plan (IEP) team.

<u>007.034D</u> Certification Endorsement Requirements: This endorsement requires the applicant to have completed a baccalaureate degree in communication disorders/speech-language pathology.

<u>007.034E</u> Limited Purpose: This endorsement may be placed only on the Nebraska Provisional Special Services Certificate with validity, terms and renewal options as described for that certificate in 92 NAC 21.

<u>007.034F</u> No Nebraska Standard Institution of Higher Education will be granted approval to offer a program of study leading to this endorsement.

007.045 Special Services Coaching

<u>007.045A</u> Grade Levels: 7-12

007.045B Endorsement Type: Special Services

<u>007.045C</u> The endorsement shall be valid only in the area of coaching extracurricular activities and may appear only on a special services certificate.

<u>007.045D</u> The endorsement shall be valid only in the Nebraska school system requesting the issuance of such certificate and shall require:

<u>007.045D1</u> Successful completion of the following content from a college with an approved teacher education program or from other organizations who provide instruction in the same content:

007.045D1a First aid, health and safety for coaches, and007.045D1b Fundamentals of coaching.
